<b>Harry Paye:</b> <i>The Famous Poole Pirate</i>  2 hours	<b>KS1 History:</b> ✓ Significant historical events, people and places in own locality	Climb aboard the museum's pirate ship to learn about Poole's famous pirate hero, 'Arry Paye and life on board ship long ago.
<b>Mrs Jolly's Jubilee:</b> <i>Life in Queen Victoria's Britain</i>  2 hours	<b>KS1 History:</b> ✓ The lives of significant individuals in the past; ✓ Comparing aspects of life in different periods ✓ Historical terms and vocabulary	Step back to 1897, the year of Queen Victoria's Diamond jubilee. Join a local household to prepare for the celebrations and find out about life in Victorian times.
<b>Toys Through Time</b>  2 hours	<b>KS1 History:</b> ✓ Changes within living memory; ✓ Chronology; ✓ Words and phrases relating to time  <b>KS1 D&amp;T:</b> ✓ Materials and components	Travel back in time to find out about toys from the past. Practice ordering toys using key words linked to chronology.

<b>Fun and Games:</b> <i>Local Leisure and Entertainment from the 1930's - present</i>  2 hours	<b>KS2 History:</b> ✓ A study of an aspect or theme in British history that extends pupils' chronological knowledge beyond 1066	Learn about leisure and entertainment in Poole from the 1930's to the present. Compare and contrast what people did for fun and how technology has changed the hobbies we have today.
<b>Changing Societies:</b> <i>From hunter-gatherers to Iron Age Britons</i>  2 or 4 hours	<b>KS2 History:</b> ✓ Changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age; ✓ Connections, contrasts and trends over time	Step outdoors to compare similarities and differences between Stone Age hunter-gatherers and Iron Age farmers in the inspiring setting of Upton Country Park. Learn ancient techniques for foraging, cooking and shelter-making.
<b>Settlers and Invaders</b>  4 hours	<b>KS2 History:</b> ✓ The Roman Empire and its impact on Britain; ✓ The power of the Roman army, culture and beliefs	Learn about life in Roman Britain through drama and hands-on activities at the authentic Roman House in Upton Country Park.

<b>Where I Live:</b> <i>Exploring Local History</i>  2 hours	<b>KS1 History:</b> ✓ Significant historical events, people and places in own locality;  <b>KS2 History:</b> ✓ A local history study	Using Poole History Centre and museum, have a go at doing some real historical research to find out about Poole in the past.
<b>Upton House:</b> <i>A Local History Study</i>  2 hours	<b>KS1 History:</b> ✓ Significant historical events, people and places in own locality  <b>KS2 History:</b> ✓ A study of an aspect of a site dating from a period beyond 1066	Discover the fascinating history of Upton House, its links to local history and the effects that its owners had on the land surrounding it.
